# **MEETING HELD ON AUGUST 29, 2006**

The Board of Supervisors of Sioux County, Iowa, met pursuant to adjournment at 9:30 o'clock a.m. with Chairman Mark Sybesma presiding. Members present were Loren Bouma, Vernon Beernink, Mark Sybesma, John Degen and Stanley L. De Haan.

Minutes of the meeting held on August 22, 2006, were submitted and the Chairman declared them approved.

Motion by Bouma and supported by Degen to increase Department appropriations in all departments to 50% of the budgeted amount, excepting the Information Technology Department which is appropriated at 100%. Roll call on vote: Bouma, Yes; Beernink, Yes; Degen, Yes; De Haan, Yes, Sybesma, Yes.

# **RESOLUTION No. 2006-23**

## TO INCREASE APPROPRIATIONS FOR ALL DEPARTMENTS

WHEREAS, it is desired to increase appropriations for all Departments for fiscal year 2007 in accordance with Section 331.434(6), Code of Iowa,

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Supervisors of Sioux County, Iowa as follows:

- SECTION 1. The amount itemized for the Data Processing department on the attached schedule is hereby appropriated at 100% of total expenditures and the amounts itemized by fund and by department for all other departments on the attached schedule are hereby appropriated at 50% for each department, as listed in the last column on the same line of the attached schedule.
- SECTION 2. Subject to the provisions of other county procedures and regulations, and applicable state law, the appropriations authorized under Section 1 shall constitute authorization for the departments listed to make expenditures or incur obligations from the itemized funds.
- SECTION 3. In accordance with Section 331.437, Code of Iowa, no department or officer shall expend or contract to expend any money or incur any liability, or enter into any contract which by its terms involves the expenditures of money for a purpose in excess of the amounts appropriated pursuant to this Resolution.
- SECTION 4. If at any time during the fiscal year 2007 budget year the Auditor shall ascertain that the available resources of a department for that year will be less than said department total

appropriations, he or she shall immediately so inform the Board and recommend appropriate corrective action.

SECTION 5. The Auditor shall establish separate accounts for the appropriations authorized in Section 1, each of which account shall indicate the amount of the appropriation, the amounts charged thereto, and the unencumbered balance. The Auditor shall report the status of such accounts to the applicable departments and officers monthly during fiscal year 2007 budget year.

SECTION 6. All appropriations authorized pursuant to this Resolution lapse at the close of business on June 30, 2007.

A letter of resignation from Robert Hagey, County Treasurer, was read by the Chairman. Motion by Beernink and supported by De Haan to accept the resignation of Robert Hagey as Sioux County Treasurer effective September 1, 2006. Motion carried, unanimous in favor.

Lois Huitink, Auditor, was instructed to place a notice in the official county newspapers stating the intent of the Board of Supervisors to make an appointment on September 15 to fill the vacant office of Sioux County Treasurer. A news release will also be sent to other newspapers in the County.

Sioux County will reimburse the City of Hull for time Randy Feenstra is working in the Treasurer's office.

Motion by Bouma and supported by Beernink to pay members of the Zoning Board and Board of Adjustment \$50 per meeting plus mileage effective September 1, 2006. Motion carried unanimous in favor.

The Board discussed the sale of 3.26 acres of Sioux County property near Maurice. Robert Rice bought property in 1987. In 1989 the property was sold to Sioux County, at which time the land was improved. Similar cases that have gone to Court have determined that the County would own the land by adverse possession. Beernink and Degen will work with the

owner of the property to discuss a selling price.

Motion by De Haan and supported by Bouma to approve a Resolution offering condolences to the family of Pfc. William E. Thorne. Roll call on vote: Bouma, Yes; Beernink, Yes; Degen, Yes; De Haan, Yes, Sybesma, Yes.

No written comments against the permit application were received by the County Auditor. Casey Westergard was present for the Public Hearing. No negative comments were received from neighbors.

No written comments against the permit application were received by the County Auditor.
