

**NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN TO THE ELIGIBLE VOTERS OF SIOUX COUNTY, IOWA THAT THE
PRIMARY ELECTION WILL BE HELD ON TUESDAY, JUNE 4, 2024**

The polls of said election will be open from 7:00 a.m. until 8:00 p.m. for the purpose of placing in nomination candidates for U.S. House of Representatives, State Senator, State House of Representatives, Sioux County District Supervisors (Districts #1, #3 and #5), County Sheriff and County Auditor.

Voters must vote in their precinct of residence. Please read this notice carefully to determine your correct voting location. Voting locations for this election have changed for many voters. If you are unsure of your voting precinct for this election, please contact the Sioux County Auditor and Commissioner of Elections at 712-737-2216 or by email at auditor@siouxcounty.org. All polling locations for this election are handicapped accessible. However, any voter who is physically unable to enter a polling place has the right to vote in the voter's vehicle. For further information, please contact the Sioux County Auditor's office at 712-737-2216 or auditor@siouxcounty.org. For TTY access, dial 711 + 712-737-2216.

Pre-registered voters are required to provide an approved form of identification at the polling place before receiving and casting a regular ballot. Voters who are not pre-registered – such as voters registering to vote on election day – and voters changing precincts must also provide proof of residence. A voter who is unable to provide an approved form of identification (or prove residence if required) 1) may have the voter's identity/residence attested to by another registered voter in the precinct, 2) prove identity and residence using Election Day Registration documents, or 3) cast a provisional ballot and provide proof of identity/residence at the county auditor's office by 12:00 p.m., Monday, June 10, 2024. Election Day Registrant attestors must provide an approved form of identification. All voters are advised as to the requirements of voter registration in order to be eligible to vote at said election. The voter pre-registration deadline is 5:00 p.m. on May 20, 2024. Absentee ballots are available in the auditor's office during regular business hours during the absentee voting period of May 15- June 3. If you are challenged as unqualified to vote, you may cast a ballot in accordance with Section 49.81, Iowa Code. Absentee and special voter ballots will be counted at the Sioux County Courthouse.

Public testing of the voting equipment for all precincts will be conducted at the Sioux County Courthouse the week of May 20th, 2024 from 8:00 a.m. – 4:30 p.m.

Section 43.38, Iowa Code states that in order to vote in the Primary Election, you must choose either the Democratic or Republican ballot. You may declare or change your party affiliation at the polls on election day according to Section 43.42, Iowa Code, by noting that change when you sign the election register provided by the precinct election officials.

Candidate names are rotated by precinct. Eligibility to vote on various offices depends on your particular precinct. An explanation of what precincts comprise the various state and local county supervisor districts in Sioux County is as follows:
